What will your Chemnitz of tomorrow look like?

As BÜNDNISGRÜNE, we want Chemnitz to be a good home - for everyone who lives here. But what makes a good home? Is it a place where you can fulfil yourself? Or is it more a place where you can find peace and quiet? Let's shape Chemnitz together and make sure that it is a good and safe home - today, tomorrow and the day after tomorrow.

However, a good home cannot be taken for granted. We are already noticing climate change very clearly in Chemnitz. In summer, the 'Nischel's forehead glows: the Karl-Marx-Kopf heats up to almost 60 degrees Celsius on hot days. While the 'Nischel' can withstand the heat well, it is increasingly becoming a problem for living creatures in the city - whether for humans, animals or plants. It is up to us as a city society to work together and with vigour to ensure that we tackle the consequences of climate change in Chemnitz intelligently.

In our programme, we formulate impulses, solutions and goals. What do you think about more greenery in the city? How about drinking fountains and shade in school playgrounds? What do you think about affordable electricity from renewable energies? Would you a tram line across the Kaßberg? Let's talk about it and work on it together.

Preserving what is important and valuable is not just a community task with regard to climate change. It is also our shared responsibility with regard to our democracy. Do you remember how we took to the streets together in 2018 in favour of the rule of law, diversity and human rights and against contempt for them? We want the democratic majority in Chemnitz to be visible and safe. We want everyone to be safe, regardless of whether they are migrants, queer people or people with different political views. 'Chemnitz is our city' - a shared home and a place of peaceful coexistence. As the Alliance of Greens, we have a clear stance and concrete ideas on how democracy can be secured and practised. Let's tackle this together.



Community action does not fall from the sky. We need spaces and structures for this. Neighbourhoods, community gardens, sports clubs - this is where people with ideas and drive can come together to make Chemnitz an even better place to live.



With our programme, we want to support existing spaces for encounters and creativity and create new ones where there is a need. In our programme, we outline a city of togetherness and active civic participation. We do not want to present ready-made solutions or fixed ideas, but rather work together with you as part of the urban community to ensure that Chemnitz is a good home for us all. With our ideas, which we present with the words 'Chemnitz as ...', we want to present a concrete vision for our city that shows what we can be if we utilise the potential that Chemnitz has to offer.

As a result, our programme is not a 10-point plan that we want to work through with our city council group, but rather an invitation to the city community to join us in fighting for these visions and goals.

Democratic majorities are needed to ensure good conditions for a better Chemnitz from the city council. Your vote also determines how much room for manoeuvre there will be. We will continue to work in the city council to ensure that we can shape Chemnitz as an active community - as a good home for everyone! A city that becomes a good home through an active community is rightly the European Capital of Culture. A city that is shaped by an active community is inviting for skilled labour, which we urgently need. It offers good conditions for trade, industry and retail, it can grow and become better and better.

Chemnitz is our common home.

What do you think? Shall we go for it?!

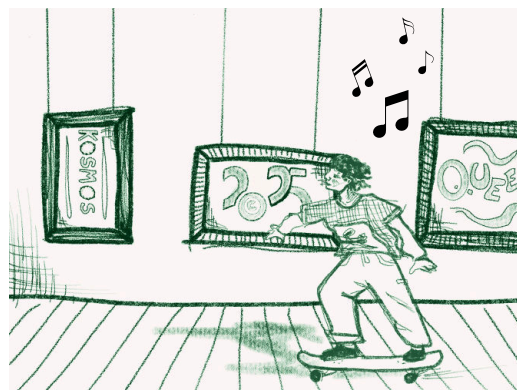


Chemnitz as a city of education

- High-quality daycare centres for all children
- Modern equipment for schools
- Multi-professional teams in all schools
- Funding of democracy education and anti-discrimination work in schools
- Strengthening extracurricular learning centres
- Model projects for neighbourhood services such as community gardens or community spaces
- Multi-generation centres as meeting places
- Support for all learners with learning difficulties at school
- Funding of voluntary work in education

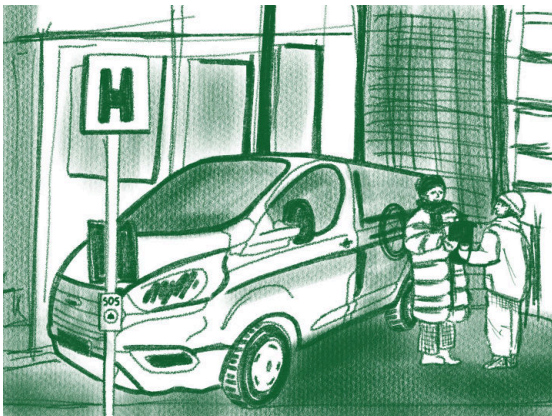
Chemnitz as a cultural (capital) city

- At least 5% of municipal cultural funding for the independent cultural scene
- Expansion of barrier-free cultural venues
- Preservation and utilisation of cultural venues after 2025
- Stabilisation of the KOSMOS festival
- Revitalisation of youth cultural events such as 'Rock am Kopp'
- Expansion of the night bus service
- Recognising the EhrenamtsCard (Card für Volunteers) in municipal facilities
- Establishment of night-time management for cultural institutions
- Funding of queer culture through an action plan
- More art in public spaces through targeted support for artists and artists and participation formats



Chemnitz as a mobile city

- Development of an interconnected cycle path network with winter maintenance
- Creation of secure bicycle parking facilities in the city centre and residential areas
- Introduction of new bus routes for more direct connections between city districts
- Rapid expansion of the tram network and the Chemnitz model
- Acceleration of public transport (more bus lanes, smarter traffic lights)
- Funding of the 'city of short distances' through barrier-free pavements and refurbishment
- Expansion of sharing services for cars, bicycles and cargo bikes
- Expansion of the charging network for electric cars, including at street lamps
- Conversion of bus stops into mobility centres with park & ride facilities
- Digitalisation and real-time information in public transport
- Ensuring sufficient human resources for transport planning
- Securing solid funding for the mobility transition



Chemnitz as a sports city

- Sport for all: outdoor fitness equipment, calisthenics parks and Kneipp pools
- More sports areas: Use of school pitches for clubs
- Indoor swimming pool in the west and north
- Roller and fun sports centre
- Equitable Funding and quality improvement of sports facilities

Chemnitz as a green business location

- Funding of a sustainable economy through specialist forums, advice and targeted funding funds
- Expansion of business development for better location conditions and infrastructure
- Introduction of an urban innovation fund and support for local companies
- Attracting labour through city marketing and promoting diversity
- Counselling and support for immigrant workers and integration into companies
- Strategy for dealing with commercial space, short-term use and accessibility by public transport
- Funding of renewable energy and utilisation of waste heat in the economy
- Expansion of climate-friendly freight transport and Funding of regional cooperation
- Accelerating digitalisation in communication and administration
- Promoting the circular economy through collaboration between trade and research
- Activating attractive areas for companies to set up business in cooperation with neighbouring municipalities

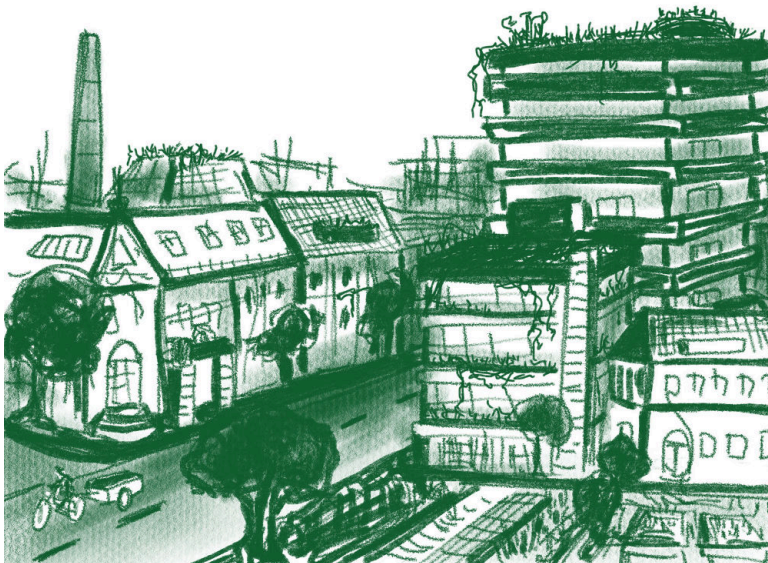
Chemnitz as a city with clean energy

- Promoting the expansion of renewable energies through citizen participation
- Multiple utilisation of areas, e.g. car parks with solar panels
- Support for agri-PV for additional sources of income and increased yields
- Conversion of the district heating source to fossil free
- free energy sources & new approaches for heat supply
- Funding of the hydrogen competence centre and Connection to the hydrogen core network
- Strengthening citizen energy projects to promote
- renewable energies & lowering electricity prices



Chemnitz as a green city

- Creation of fresh air corridors and expansion of urban greenery in the city centre
- Funding of façade and roof greening as well as green traffic routes
- Reforestation of empty tree grates and expansion of the tree sponsorship programme
- Climate-friendly construction and renovation projects with sustainable materials
- Converting Chemnitz into a sponge city to store rainwater for dry periods
- Promoting regional products and growing fruit trees in public spaces
- Protection and Funding of biodiversity through targeted green management
- Supporting allotment gardens as retreats and oases of biodiversity
- Strengthening the environmental agency through personnel, financial and structural measures



Chemnitz as a healthy city

- Strengthening and supporting employees in the healthcare sector
- Further development of the MEDiC study programme to secure medical professionals
- Establishment of a municipal training institute for specialists
- Supporting the birth centre as an important pillar of obstetrics
- Funding of the Chemnitz Nutrition Council for healthy nutrition
- Expansion of urban gardening and urban farming for regional foods
- Measures to improve air quality and reduce noise in the city
- Funding of sporting activities through improved infrastructure and safe routes to school



Chemnitz as a city of vibrant democracy

- More efficient administration through more specialised staff and tailored training programmes
- Establishment of a youth office for youth-orientated participation
- Conversion of citizens' platforms into elected district councils
- Local city administration through personal contacts and residents' meetings
- Introduction of a Chemnitz app for citizen participation and simplification of administrative processes
- Clear communication from the city administration on various channels
- Citizen participation in decisions on urban design, e.g. through surveys
- Continuation and expansion of participation projects such as 'Take a seat!'
- Funding of associations and initiatives for an open society
- Promoting diversity and anti-discrimination in the city administration

Chemnitz as a city of togetherness



- Creative waste disposal solutions with talking rubbish bins
 - and effective publicity stickers
 - Further development of the 'Nette Toilette' initiative and construction of new public toilets including signposting on signposts
 - Support for animal shelters and animal welfare organisations and
 - Testing the zoo as a rescue centre for wild animals
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- Creation of better dog meadows with fenced areas and more dog bag dispensers
 - Provision of sufficient public seating and senior-friendly equipment to slow down everyday life
 - Creation of multi-generational squares and houses as meeting places for all age groups

Chemnitz as a region in Europe

- Funding of intercultural exchange and international networking through visits by school classes and clubs to EU partner cities
- Hiring a specialist for European affairs in the Chemnitz administration and strengthening the city's European office
- Professional utilisation of EU funding through early application and a focus on the local economy and sustainable goals
- Implementation of the European 'Green Deal' in Chemnitz to promote the circular economy and sustainability
- Expanding participation in the 'Mayors for Peace' peace initiative to promote peace and sustainability at an international level



Chemnitz as a safe city

- Safety in urban planning through bright design and good lighting
- Measures against right-wing extremism with police and regulatory authorities
- Development of a safety forum for dialogue and action planning
- Expansion of traffic monitoring
- Establishment of support services for homeless people such as a sleep-in centre and the sleep-in centre and the Chemnitz cold bus
- Regular evaluation and supplementation of municipal support services

What does Chemnitz need to be a 'good home for everyone'? This question is at the centre of our concerns when it comes to the future of our city. We want Chemnitz to be a city that people enjoy living in.
